SCAM ALERT: Fraudulent Text Messages Targeting Utah Motorists

SALT LAKE CITY (July 30, 2025) – The Utah State Tax Commission’s Motor Vehicle Division (DMV) is warning the public about a fraudulent text message circulating in Utah that falsely claims the recipient has an outstanding traffic ticket and threatens enforcement and legal actions if immediate payment is not made. A picture of the text message is below.

Scammers commonly use these deceptive tactics to pressure individuals into making payments without verifying the legitimacy of the claim.

How to Protect Yourself:

- **Verify before paying** – If you receive a suspicious notice regarding a traffic ticket or any other DMV related matter, contact the Utah DMV directly at **801-297-7780** to confirm its authenticity.
- **Do not respond to the text message** – Avoid clicking any links or calling any phone numbers listed in the fraudulent messages.

Utah DMV Final Notice:
Enforcement will begin July 30.

Our records show that as of today, you still have an outstanding traffic ticket. Per Utah Motor Vehicle Code D508-12.083, if you do not pay by July 29, 2025, we will take the following actions:

1. Report to DMV violation database
2. Suspend your vehicle registration effective July 30
3. Suspend driving privileges for 30 days
4. Go to toll booth and be charged a 40% service fee
5. You may be prosecuted and your credit score will be affected
